TODAY'S ACTIVITIES WOODENBOAT SHOW

Settlers in the Mystic area found good wood, sheltered water, and flat land ideal for shipbuilding. By the mid-19th century, ship and boat yards lined the six-mile Mystic River.

Two yards operated on the present Museum site: George Greenman & Co., beginning in 1837, and Charles Mallory & Sons, beginning in 1851. As shipbuilding waned in the 1880s, textile mills and other manufacturing developed. The 19 acres that are now Mystic Seaport had only a row of houses along Greenmanville Avenue and a few shipyard and mill buildings.

Mystic Seaport, founded in 1929, actively pursues the collection, preservation, and exhibition of artifacts and skills related to maritime history and its influence on American life. It is a privately operated, non-profit institution.




