

SEAPORT VILLAGE

Stroll our historic seaport village, decorated for the season. Experience 19th-century domestic life and learn about the maritime trades that supported life at sea and on land. Museum interpreters demonstrate cooking in the Buckingham-Hall house and trade skills in the cooperage, shipsmith, print shop, shipcarver shop, and more.

KIDS ACTIVITY ZONE

Learn the secrets of the night sky at a Treworgy Planetarium show, or let the little ones climb aboard the ships playscape. The Funk Children's Museum (ages 7 and under) and Home Port (ages 8-12) offer children and families the chance to spend quality time at arts and crafts, games, and more.

MCGRAW GALLERY QUAD

Reveal your personal connection to the sea through our specially curated exhibitions that delve into ocean exploration, maritime innovation, recreation, art, artifacts, and more.

NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK VESSELS

Imagine life on a ship by visiting one of our national historic landmark vessels: 1841 whaleship, *Charles W. Morgan*; 1866 Noank smack, *Emma C. Berry*; 1908 steamboat, *Sabino*; and the 1921 fishing schooner, *L. A. Dunton*.

PRESERVATION SHIPYARD

Witness traditional shipbuilding techniques as skilled shipwrights maintain historic wooden vessels. The Henry B. du Pont Preservation Shipyard was the first shipyard built specifically for preservation in the United States, and possibly the world, marking a new era in maritime preservation.

GET OUT ON THE WATER

Navigate the waterfront with a river cruise on the historic vessel *Sabino*. Sail aboard the captained Crosby catboat *Breck Marshall*, or be your own captain on a rowboat, sailboat, or pedal boat from the Museum's Boathouse.
