ENTWINED: FREEDOM, SOVEREIGNTY, AND THE SEA STILLMAN BUILDING (6)

Entwined centers maritime histories in Indigenous, African, and African-descended worldviews and experiences. Unraveling the threads of existing maritime narratives for the history of the Dawnland (New England), Indigenous dispossession, and racialized slavery, this exhibition is rooted in voices and histories that have been silent or silenced.

SEA AS MUSE R. J. SCHAEFER BUILDING (2)

A gorgeous selection of silver, furniture, stained glass, and other decorative arts from the collections, all inspired by sealife and life on the sea. Learn about the design process and craft of silversmithing through tools, interviews, and video demonstrations.

THE ART OF THE BOAT: PHOTOGRAPHS FROM THE ROSENFELD COLLECTION MEETING HOUSE (3)

The Rosenfeld Collection, acquired in 1984 by Mystic Seaport Museum, is one of the largest archives of maritime photographs in the United States. This Collection contains nearly one million pieces from 1881 to the present. Images are captured in various formats, from glass plate negatives to color transparencies, and from glossy prints to photographic murals.

SPINELESS: A GLASS MENAGERIE OF BLASCHKA MARINE INVERTEBRATES

C. D. MALLORY BUILDING (4) (closes March 2, 2025)

View these exquisite and highly accurate 19th-century glass models of marine invertebrates such as anemones, octopuses, sea slugs, and sea squirts, all created by father and son glassmakers Leopold and Rudolf Blaschka of Dresden, Germany. Over 40 models are on exhibit.

HOME PORT P. R. MALLORY BUILDING (4)

Home Port is the Museum's family activity center. It primarily serves children ages 8-12 with a variety of crafts and amusements.

FIGUREHEADS AND SHIPCARVINGS WENDELL BUILDING (5)

Ships' figureheads were an important form of public art in the 19th century. A figurehead gave a ship its personality, and each one expressed a unique meaning, imbued with values and reflecting popular culture of the time. This exhibit aims to help visitors see these objects through 19th-century eyes and to understand and appreciate the craft of carving figureheads as an important art form.

FROM CLIPPERS TO CONTAINERS STILLMAN BUILDING, SECOND FLOOR (6)

Explore the original ship's cabin of the 1883 square-rigged sailing ship Benjamin F. Packard.

SUSAN STUCKE FUNK CHILDREN'S MUSEUM (10)

The Children's Museum is a hands-on exhibit for children ages 4 to 7 and their parents.


